Challenge Day- Tuesday 22nd February 2024

Year 9

What did they have to do:

Throughout the day year 9 students participated in a variety of dance and drama activities to really stretch them creatively and challenge them to explore not only their inner performer but also their inner theatre critic, director, choreographer and editor.

Students participated in a Hairspray workshop with 'Alexander Rowles' a professional dancer where they learnt a routine from the show. They also worked collaboratively to create a 'dance for film' where students explored creating dance content specifically for film. They used different camera angles and had fun filming dance all around the school, these clips were edited and sent to Mrs Jarman who will create a whole year 9 video. The students also had time looking at and

performing a script from 'My mother said I never should...' a funny play which allows them to play a variety of characters and to finish off the dance and drama element of the day, they watched a live recording of hairspray and had their go at being theatre critics. They reviewed the lighting, set, costume and sound and evaluated its effectiveness.

The final session of the day was a safety on public transport talk. This was a fun, interactive and insightful talk which gave year 9 lots of useful tips and strategies for how to stay safe not only on their way too and from school but in all areas of life when using transport.

What did they like about each session:

Students commented that they 'loved' trying new things and being able to spend the day being creative. Another said that they loved learning the Hairspray routine from a dancer who was in the show, he encouraged and motivated them to have fun and build their confidence. The dance for film was a very popular hour with students being extremely creative using the school benches, art walls and field to create interesting concepts.

Overall:

Overall the staff were extremely impressed with the way year 9 conducted themselves throughout the day, they participated well with an open mind and a willingness to try new skills and improve. The whole day had a lovely feel and it was lovely to see year 9 not only enjoy themselves but thrive.

Vocational Faculty Challenge Day

The Vocational Faculty shared aspects of their subject in more detail with the Year 10 students.

In ICT students learned how to create animations using Wick Editor, online animation software. This was something the students were unfamiliar with and thoroughly enjoyed using newly gained skills in engaging and fun activities.

Students researched and gained an indepth understanding of dementia in their Health and Social Care session. They gained knowledge on the symptoms, diagnosis and management of this condition, creating an informative poster to be displayed in the classroom. The business sessions enabled students to gain knowledge in relation to financial documents with a focus on the terminology and the meanings of words found on a payslip.

Students replicated the TV show Dragons Den in Economics, coming up with their own business idea, costing it and then selling it to the Dragons – their classmates.

For Law, students learned how laws are made by Parliament and then came up with some laws of their own.

All students engaged and seemed to enjoy the sessions, they hopefully gained some new knowledge and may have been inspired to further research these topics.

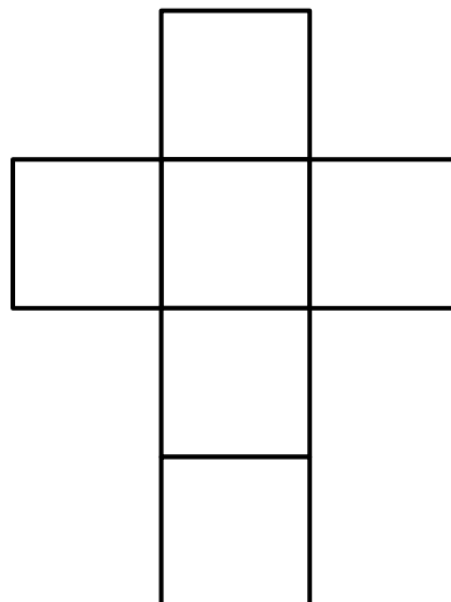

NEWTON'S CROSSES PUZZLE 5A

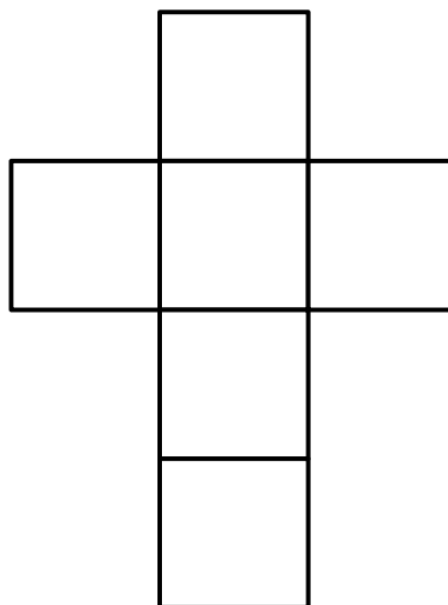
1) Write the numbers -6, -4, 1, 2, 3 and 5 in the correct place so that each line of the cross adds up to 3.

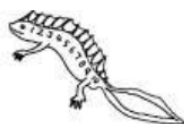

2) Write the numbers -6, -5, 2, 3, 4 and 7 in the squares so that each line of the cross adds up to 0.

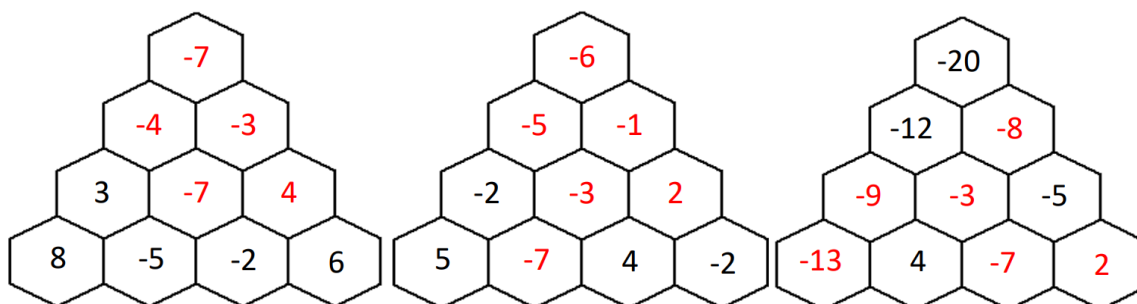
