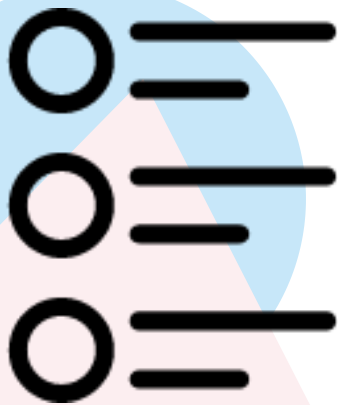
What are exam grades like?

Each year the percentage of students attaining 4 and above and the percentage of students attaining the top grades has been increasing. KS5 has had 100% pass rates for several years and are working for more students to attain the highest grades



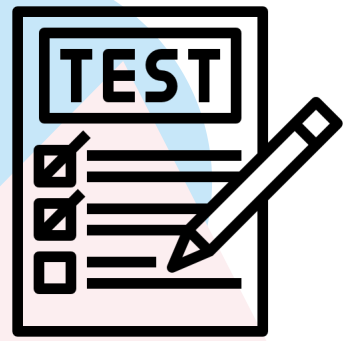
What trips does the department organise?

Do students have to take Geography at GCSE?

Currently the school follows the EBacc and students must take 1 of the following History, Geography and a Language. Some students often pick more than 1 of these subjects



What is behaviour like?

As a school we use a sanction and reward system that has been very successful in ensuring largely positive behaviour in lessons. Instances of extreme behaviour are dealt with effectively by SLT and students disrupting others learning are removed from lessons



What topics do we teach

We teach a variety of topics including: Map Skills, World Cities, Ecosystems, Globalisation, Terrorism, Current Affairs, Coasts, the Economic World, Urban Environments, Tectonic Hazards, Weather Hazards, Migration, Identity and Sovereignty, Carbon Cycle and Water Cycle
