Cambridge University – Year 10 Targeted Workshop on applying for competitive Universities

We were delighted to welcome Gwyneth Hamand from Gonville and Caius College, Cambridge University to present a workshop to selected year 10 students with aspirations on applying for competitive Universities including Cambridge and other Russell Group Universities.

The aims of the workshop were to encourage young people in year 10 in to consider what they need to do now to support them

making applications to competitive universities, and in particular Oxford and Cambridge, in the future.

The students completed activities including:

- Learning about selective universities and what they are looking for
- Engaging in critical thinking activities, students reflected on their interests and how to explore them further
- Considered the importance of choosing the right A level combinations
- Addressing some of the myths around selective universities
- Concluding with a debate about a topical issue

"The Oxbridge workshop was very insightful, interactive, and interesting. We delved into the daily life of a university student and explored the contrasts between school and university. Gwyneth shared the pros and cons of university life and provided practical advice for navigating unfamiliar situations. Additionally, we also received guidance on making A-Level choices that aligned with our desired degrees. Gwyneth also provided us with various websites that for further reading, which was very useful and interesting. Overall, I found this workshop highly beneficial, and it prompted me to reflect on my future decisions. Many thanks to Mrs. Smith and Gwyneth for organizing this event."


Careers - Year 9 Key Stage 4 Course Selection booklet Prize Winners


Catering Service price increase

The latest National Living Wage has increased the employment cost to the school and in particular the catering staff. This cost will need to be passed on to some of the food products. This will not affect the cost of the main school meal known as Enjoy, Street Food and Hot Grab and Go that remains at £2.60 along with bottle water prices remaining the same. These new price menus will be added to the Blackfen website as soon as we receive them. These can be found under School Life – Parents – School Catering – Menu Enjoy – Master Menu. The increase of 5p will affect all other products and will start when we return from the Easter break.

I would like to take this opportunity to raise the fact that there are still quite a number of students that are entitled to Free School Meals not taking up this offer. For whatever reason your young person is not taking up this offer I can assure you that not only will they be receiving a very good nutritious meal the whole process is anonymous. They receive £2.60 to be used for a lunch time meal. They can still purchase items from the catering areas at breakfast and break time however, this will need to come from their catering account topped up by yourselves.
