GCSE and BTEC examination results are published on **Thursday 24th August** and will be available for collection in the **Performance Space from 9.00am to 11.00am only**. Results that are not collected at this time will be posted home to students. Parents are warmly invited to join students in the Performance Space for this special occasion and may collect results on behalf of students as long as suitable identification is provided, for example, a driving licence photo card or passport. It is not possible for students to collect results on behalf of their friends.


