## Microsoft Excel

You might not know this one so well. Why improve your skills in this? You are likely to need it in the future:

- At college/university, to help you include professional charts and graphs in PPTs.
- Maths, Economics, Statistics & Sciences students will almost certainly use Excel in their career. Anyone aiming to work in an office one day will usually need to use Excel at some point.
- Apprentices! Excel boosts your CV for most roles e.g. business administration, marketing, finance.
